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MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD By Janet Heath

An emergency can strike anyone, anytime. Is our neighborhood ready for the next big storm? What if there is a gas main break, who will turn off your gas if you're away from home? Are you prepared for an earthquake? What can we all do together to secure our neighborhood and check on our neighbors during the first 4 hours following a disaster? Who, amongst our neighbors has a generator, AED, first aid skills or other abilities that we might all need in an emergency?

Our homeowners association is taking preparedness seriously and has a plan to bring to the membership at our annual meeting on August 7th. The plan, called 'Map Your Neighborhood' is sponsored by the State of Washington and is rolling out in neighborhoods throughout Kitsap County .

Why am I writing to you? I've lived on Empress Court for the past 16 years and I'm your local American Red Cross Chapter Director. I take preparedness VERY seriously. While serving with the Red Cross for the past five years, my team has responded to brushfires, home fires, out of state wildfires, snowstorms, windstorms, hurricanes, and floods. You won't see us around the house much if a disaster strikes, so we hope you are ready to take care of yourselves and volunteer to help take care of others!

DEFEATING DANDELIONS By Gerry Austin

Centuries ago, as the new world was being settled, Europeans brought with them a wonderful plant, *Taraxacum officinale*. It could be used as both medicine and a salad crop. Who could have foreseen that it would become the bane of gardeners and homeowners everywhere? We all know the bright yellow flowers, with a long taproot, and broad leaves. They're sunny and cheerful, but also multiply rapidly and can take over a lawn.

There are several ways to get rid of dandelion. I prefer pulling them with this really slick tool I bought at the hardware store for about \$20. With it, you can get the entire root; the dandelion will never grow back. You can use it standing up, so you don't have to bend over, or sit, which is great on the knees.

Keeping a healthy lawn will help your lawn out-compete dandelions. Give your lawn organic fertilizer or compost to ensure you've got healthy soil and enough nutrients for your lawn. Aerating and dethatching as necessary will also help your lawn thrive.

A last resort would be to use an herbicide such as weed and feed. A combination fertilizer with a weed preventative is also a good option, where it will also help your lawn. Read and follow the manufacturers' instructions and application guidelines, as incorrect use can hurt your lawn. Herbicides can also cause harm to humans, pets and wildlife so use this option cautiously.

Sadly, this is one job where the Weed Dragon is not effective. With their long tap root, dandelions will quickly spring back up about a week after being burned.
